# Hepatitis B Nursing: Addressing the Silent Epidemic in Primary Care

## Learning Methods

**This course has two components:**

Module 1 is an online learning component designed to introduce key concepts of hepatitis B nursing before attending the Zoom Session (Module 2). It is recommended that participants complete the pre-reading activity and view the pre-recorded webinar prior to attending the course. The online learning modules and other suggested pre/post course educational activities are endorsed independently for CPD hours.

Module 2 is a 2-hour Zoom session providing practical skills and knowledge in hepatitis B nursing in the primary care context. It includes a PowerPoint presentation with interactive polls, and a case study for discussion

## Learning Objectives

1. Outline the epidemiology of hepatitis B and the risk factors for hepatitis B transmission
2. Identify opportunities for screening, vaccination and linkage to care
3. Explain the nurse's role in identifying, assessing and monitoring patients with chronic hepatitis B to initiate practice change
