

Quarter 2 DPH Risk Communicators meeting

The next quarterly statewide Risk Communicators meeting will be held virtually on Wednesday, afternoon from 1:30 to 3:00. There will be guest presenters from state Emergency Preparedness, Epidemiology and from Ernst & Young. There will be opportunities for district highlights and questions for the group. The agenda includes topics such as plan development, conference highlights, and training, specifically for Media/Crisis and Emergency Risk Communication training. The next DPH CERC training is in the early development stage but is expected to be held in mid-September (tentatively September 19), in Rome.

Byron Lobsinger walked the multi-agency group through their roles in a potential mass fatality incident. Plans and resources were discussed, including some that are still being developed or updated.

On Thursday morning there will be the annual review of the state DPH Emergency Operations Plan and the monthly statewide EPR call in the afternoon.
