
RTOERO members can recommend students from their family or community for a post- secondary scholarship.

The project involves weaving milk bags into sturdy mats. Volunteers cut up the bags and others weave them using large looms designed for this. Needlework and Crafts



On Thursday October 13, we held our first session on Domestic Violence. The session focused on the broader scope of "DV". The session was presented by Dr. Nazilia Isgandarova, (U of T) and Imam Irshad Osman and Margaret. It was an outstanding session which provided real insight into the impact and predominance of "DV". Out of the Shadows: Recognizing Domestic Abuse and Supportive Behaviours Session 2: Wednesday, February 1, 2023 (10 a.m.to 11 a.m.)

The One Voice speakers for session two will help participants recognize the signs of Domestic Violence and coercive control, as well as indications of trauma. Other areas that will be addressed include:

- How to recognize abuse when it "doesn't bleed.
- Common types of psychological and emotional abuse, including those which target seniors.
- Patterns of behaviour that demonstrate coercive control and the vicious cycle of abuse.
- Signs of trauma.
- What do healthy and equitable relationships look like?
- Important questions to ask of a suspected victim of domestic violence.
- The importance of believing victims.
- What do supportive responses look like?

Out of the Shadows: An Escape Plan and One Voice Tool Kit Session 3: Wednesday, April 26, 2023 (10 a.m.to 11 a.m.)

Topics to be covered include:

- Formulating an escape plan.
- Connecting with community resources which help.
- How seniors can be proactive to protect themselves from abuse.
- Accessing the One Voice resource kit and website.
